

WHAT IS THE EXTENDED EDUCATION PROGRAM?

Extended Education Program is a computer-based instructional program. It is designed to be highly interactive and provide students with immediate feedback. The Extended Education Program, **which includes Evening and Saturday Schools**, allows students to work at their own learning pace. Students can choose to attend classes in the evening or on Saturday.

Staffed with certified teachers, a wide range of courses are offered in a small group setting. The staff will coordinate with the counselors from the student's home school to design a plan that works best for him/her. The goal is always to increase achievement by utilizing best practices in order to earn high school credits.

Knowing that the most powerful and effective learning model is between a student and a highly qualified teacher, this self-paced, computer-based model may not be the best option for students taking a math class, especially if it is for the first time. Students who are not strong or confident in math should discuss their needs with their guidance counselor.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

The program offers both credit recovery and initial credit courses. Both require a significant investment of students' time (each course demands a minimum average of 40 hours work.) Students have the ability to work from their home computers on assignments and quizzes. All tests and exams are administered in person. Students can have no more than three (3) absences per session. They will be withdrawn and lose credit on the fourth (4th) absence. Students who register late are responsible for completing the course(s) by the end of the semester. No extension or incompletes are granted. School sponsored absences count toward the total number of absences. Please report absences to the Coordinator.

REGISTRATION

Registration begins **Monday, November 26, 2018**. Registration forms are available in the Guidance Department of the student's home school. A counselor's signature is **required** on the registration form. This will ensure the student is enrolling in the appropriate class needed to meet graduation requirements.

Step 1: Fill out registration form

Step 2: Obtain guidance counselor's signature

Step 3: Make payment to bookstore

Step 4: Turn in registration form and receipt to the counselor. Students, please bring a copy of the registration form and receipt to your first date of attendance in the Extended Education Program.

TUITION

Tuition is \$175 per class for one-half credit.

Full tuition must be paid at the time of registration. Payment is made to the student's Bookstore.

If you are not able to participate in the program due to financial constraints, speak to a school administrator at your school regarding **financial assistance**. Funds **may** be available to cover all or part of your tuition. If your tuition is paid by these funds, you will be required to submit a copy of the appropriate, completed forms with your registration.



No refunds will be granted after January 28, 2019. There is a \$30 processing fee for any refunds requested. Refunds are only made to the individual making the original payment. A request must be accompanied with an original receipt. All refund requests must be initiated at the Student Bookstore. Refund checks are mailed within four to six (4 to 6) weeks upon receipt of the request in the District Business Office.
