Students in the **Film and TV Program** will learn fundamental and advanced production skills through engaging hands-on projects and activities using equipment, software, and other resources found in the industry.



Additionally, students have an opportunity to display their knowledge through local and national competitions. Courses are designed to give journalistic and technical know-how in television and film production. Students develop camera presence and microphone technique, and have the opportunity to work with cameras and editing. Students who love television and film or enjoy telling stories

and want to have a part in producing meaningful relevant films or television packages will enjoy the opportunities this program provides.

Film & TV



During the first year of the program, students learn preproduction, production and post-production skills and basic roles of media/film crews: director, producer, scriptwriter, anchor, reporter, sound technician, video technician, camera operator, grip, graphic/special effects artist, cinematographer and art director. Students not only learn how to write television news broadcasts, but how to present them. The second half of this course stresses the application of theories learned.

Second year students learn script writing, directing, special effects, audio sound tracking, floor direction, electronic editing, camera operation, and film for TV. Students research and produce videotape services for school video announcements and programs.

Students who choose to advanced further will apply complex skills in film and TV video creation producing and editing. Students can work as campus reporters for TUTV district program in a challenging work-based learning environment.
