#### #1 Family-Teacher Conferences 9.1.22

Buffalo families, we are excited to welcome you to our *Fall Family-Teacher Conferences*, this *Thursday, September 1, 2022*. We will begin at 4:30 p.m., concluding at 7:00 p.m. During this time you will have the opportunity to visit with each of your student's Teachers. *Please ask them how your student is performing in class. Are they showing up to class on time? Do they actively participate? Do you feel like you have a productive relationship with my child?* These are just a few examples of what you can ask your student's Teachers to find out how they are performing in their classes. Please also make it a point to stop by our *Library* as well. Here you can receive a copy of your student's schedule (if you do not have a copy, you will need this to see Teachers), receive training on *Parent Vue* (our family Grade-Check program), and receive information about other important campus items/events.

#### #2 WALGREENS, WELLS FARGO, AND MODERN SOCIAL

Families, as we have previously communicated, there is <u>NO</u> student parking or parent pick-up at *Walgreens, Wells Fargo*, and *Modern Social*. As we shared in our first edition of The Buffalo Family earlier this month, we wanted to share this reminder and expectation again. As of *September 1, 2022, The Tempe Police Department* will begin enforcement of these two important expectations. ALL parent drop-offs and pick-ups should occur within our Mill Avenue Parking Lot. We have plenty of room to accommodate additional circular traffic flow to pick up students.

#### **#3 STUDENTS ARRIVING LATE**

It is always important for students to be in school on time in all of their classes. Every school day students arrive late. During our first 7-day cycle of the school year, an average of 50 students were late to school. During our second 7-day cycle, this average increased to 80 students. Families, please make sure your students arrive at school on time. First hour begins promptly at 8:35 a.m. For students to be on time for the first hour, they must be on campus no later than 8:25 a.m. This gives them a 10-minute cushion to arrive at their first hour on time by 8:35 a.m.

#### **#4 ACT PREPARATION**

The Arizona Department of Education has determined the ACT will be the high-stakes assessments schools will undertake to determine in part school letter grades and other public school designations. With this in mind, we wanted to inform our families that we will begin preparing for this assessment immediately. Although the ACT assessment is given in the Spring, we can begin to prepare now so that our students are ready. To find out more about this assessment, you can click on ACT.org

### #5 ACT Practice; Upcoming Horizon Testing

One of the ways we prepare as a school for the ACT is by practicing on other similar assessments. Our first opportunity to do this will be from September 19-30. We will be facilitating an ACT Practice Test called Horizon. It will be taken during this time in specific classes on your student's schedule. As we get closer to this date, please encourage your student(s) to do their best on this assessment as this information will be useful for future instruction and assessment planning.

# **STAFF MEMBER: Nick Velde Position: English Teacher**


- 1) What was your favorite childhood experience? I used to camp and go fishing with my dad a lot. I still look back fondly on those memories.
